- understand the difference between good debt and bad debt.
- learn how to save.
- be introduced to investing and making your money work for you.
- learn about banking and how to set up an effective banking structure..
- learn about the four pillars of money management (**Pay yourself first, Spend wisely, save regularly and give intentionally**).
